
The Port Charlotte SDA Church has a long history of being on the cutting edge of meeting needs in our community. In the 1980s the church was commended by officials as being the very first food pantry ministry in the entire area. For about thirty years Rainbows End Daycare was touted as one of the very best places for pre-school children in Charlotte County. We have worked together to operate a Christian school since 1971. Our church is no stranger to trying new things in order to meet specific needs and reach people for Jesus.

Over the last year we have taken many important steps toward finding a new direction for community services and outreach to keep us on this front line. We have met numerous times with our entire church, elders, mission committees, and others to brainstorm where we think God is leading us. During these sessions a clear direction has become obvious to us. God was already moving in this direction for some time but He put all the pieces together for us to see in the last few weeks.

Over the last several years a handful of our members have been working with the Health Department of Charlotte County to provide love baskets for new mothers and at-risk families. The ministru has been so well received we were asked to get more involved by providing valuable things that facilitate early positive intervention for young families. All of us responded eagerly by bringing diapers for our diaper drive, and books for our book drive that benefited families working with the Department of Health. This effort left such a great impression on the leadership there that they asked our church to be their spiritual advisor and the church they are connected with in their latest effort to make Charlotte County the healthiest county in Florida. We are the only church that has been asked to do this! We have been asked to host nutrition classes with a Bible study, to provide prayer support for their staff, and help the neonatal intensive care unit at the hospital with chaplaincy services.

This relationship has gotten our creative juices flowing. Our various committees remembered the best things about Rainbows End, and Community Services. They remember the community connections, the positive influences on young children and families, the relationships formed through helping others and they decided on a new direction moving forward. They also realize the miraculous opportunities this new relationship with Charlotte County has offered us.

Using extensive research, ideas from all of you, and by working in close connection with the Health Department, the church board has decided to open a Family Resource Center in the Community Services building. This model for ministry will combine the best parts of Rainbows End (positive early childhood and family intervention) with the best parts of Community Services (help, education, and relationships) into one dynamic place.

"THIS IS THE VISION FOR THE NEW FAMILY RESOURCE CENTER - IT WILL BE A SAFE PLACE FOR CHILDREN TO PLAY AND LEARN, AND AN OPPORTUNITY FOR US TO SUPPORT YOUNG FAMILIES IN THEIR JOURNEY."

This ministry will provide a safe place for young children to learn and play while their parents stay with them. During this time caring members and volunteers will have the opportunity to get to know them, build relationships with them, show sympathy, love, and be able to offer support. This is the vision for the new Family Resource Center- it will be a safe place for children to play and learn, and an opportunity for us to support young families in their journey.

The other exciting part of this ministry will be the opportunity for all of us to use our gifts. Everything from photography, to chess, to cooking, to sewing and crafts, and much more can be used as a way to bring kids and parents together. Think about using your hobby or interest to host a small group or provide a training. All of these have potential to provide education or show love to people we meet at the Center. Family Resource Center -A safe place to play and the best place to find caring people.



Getting this off the ground will take a churchwide effort. We will need able hands in construction, design, programming, and toy assembly. When the Center is running we will need people who are good listeners and mentors who can connect with young parents. Organization and management in staffing will be vital. If your gift is more hands on we can use you. If your gift is relationalwe can use you.
